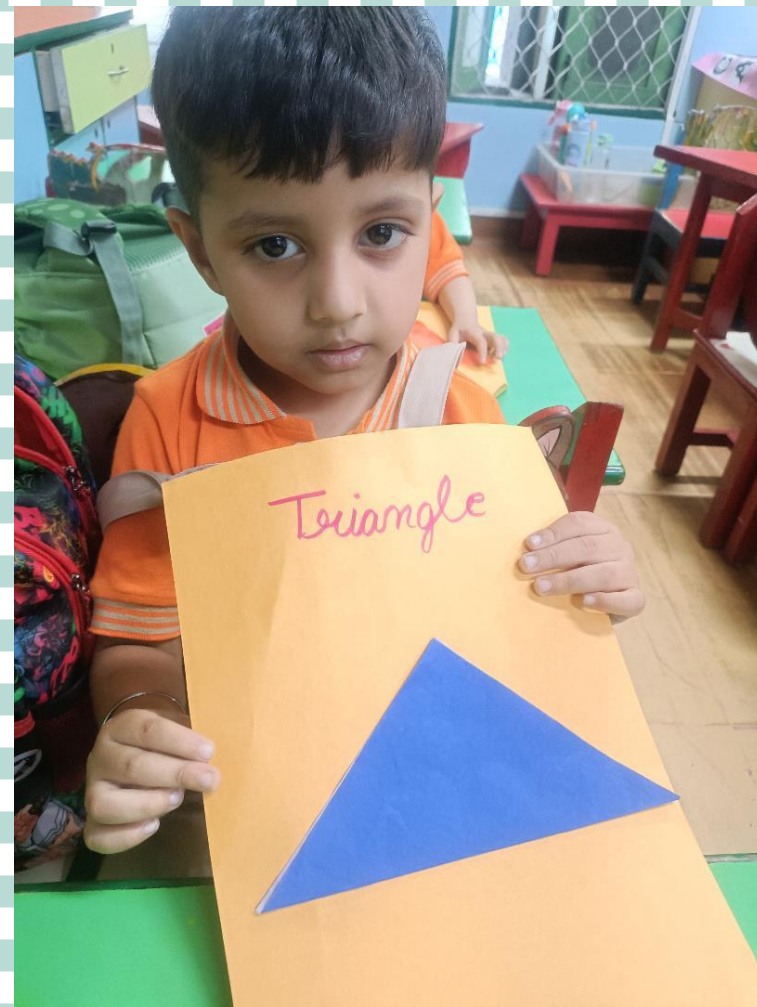


# Fold A Corner Shape A Smile!
